II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact

There are approximately 1000 unique labor organizations or unions that represent public employees in the state of Washington. SB 5045 requires all public employee unions in the state of Washington to submit to the Public Employment Relations Commission (PERC) certain information regarding the union's operations. Section 2, subsection 1, of SB 5045 requires all unions to report to PERC information about the union, including the names of officers and by-laws and procedures that govern the union's operation. PERC shall post this information on its website in a searchable format.

Section 2, subsections 3 and 4 require unions representing more than 100 employees to report to PERC all financial information about the union, including the union's assets, salaries of officers and employees, receipts of any kind, direct or indirect loans made to any officer or employee in excess of \$250, and any other disbursement that PERC may prescribe. Section 2, subsection 12 allows these reports to be consistent with the reports that unions are required to submit under the Labor Management and Reporting Act of 1959. PERC shall post all submitted reports on its website in a searchable format.

Section 2, subsections 7 through 11, require that PERC enforce the reporting provision SB 5045 and allow PERC to assess fines against any union or union official that fails to comply with the reporting requirements of SB 5045.

PERC anticipates that it will need approximately \$200/month for additional online storage space. PERC also estimates a one time \$300 cost for a software license for website development.

PERC anticipates that a .3FTE Labor Relations Adjudicator/Mediator will be needed for Section 2, subsection 7 through 11 enforcement provisions of SB 6300 and for clientele outreach and education.

PERC anticipates that a .3FTE Office Assistant 3 will be required to develop the initial database and for continued maintenance as the annual organizational and financial reports are submitted to PERC.
