The legislature is encouraging school districts to engage in professional learning communities, to build time into their school calendars for educational staff to collaborate, reflect and promote collective creativity on a weekly and potentially daily basis. Research shows that allowing educators time for professional learning communities has a positive impact on educator morale, job satisfaction and overall school climate. Indeterminate impact to expenditures. Districts who elect to implement the bill language will incur costs related to paying staff to cover classes which the certificated instructional staff are removed from the instructional setting during the regularly scheduled school day. The bill suggests four hours per week over the course of a thirty-six-week instructional calendar for a total of 36 X 4 = 144 hours of professional learning community time. This represents roughly 14% of the required annual instructional hours of 1,027. OSPI assumes that the rate of pay for classified staff to cover instructional time is \$50 per hour. An average district has approximately 275 individual certificated instructional staff. This means that the average size district participating in this encouraged activity would incur approximately 275 X 144 hrs. X \$50 per hour = \$1.9 million in additional costs related to covering instructional time.
