This bill amends Chapter 70.400 (HEALTH CARE ENTITIES—PREGNANCY COMPLICATIONS) by:

Adding a definition of "medically accurate" information.

Prohibiting health care entities from limiting health care providers from:

providing medically accurate and comprehensive information on patient health status,

providing death with dignity information,

making referrals, or

providing health care services when failure to provide the services would pose a serious risk to an individual's life or health or would violate the standard of care.

The also bill clarifies in chapter 70.245 RCW that health care providers may not prohibit another health care provider's participation in the death with dignity program when the provider is acting as an independent contractor or at another location.

This bill does not create any new work for the Department of Health and therefore is no fiscal impact.
