### Part 2 – Explanation

This bill permits an applicant for a cosmetology, hair designer, barber, manicurist, or esthetician license to register for or take their final examination before completing their instruction if within 100 hours of completion.

### 2.A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact

Sec. 1 – Amends RCW 18.16.090

- DOL may allow applicants to register for, or take, an exam before they have completed their required hours of course instruction if the applicant is within 100 hours of completion
  - o The applicant must complete required hours of course instruction before licensure

Programming will be required to allow for applicants to register for exams before their course hours have been completed.

To implement this legislation, a one-time assessment would need to be added to licenses that are funded with dedicated funds, equal to the costs contained in the expenditure section of this fiscal note. The cost allocation model applied to current expenditures is used to establish the revenue breakdown. For efficiency purposes, the department will add inclusion of this one-time assessment per license, to a planned fee rulemaking process in the spring of 2024, with any fee proposed increases to go into effect in June 2024. This bill would apply to Dedicated Fund 06L.

### 2.C - Expenditures

#### **Information Services:**

This proposal will require modifications to DOL's information technology systems. DOL will use appropriated funds to hire contract programmers to accomplish this work or to support current staff implementing this legislation within the required timeline. Appropriated funds may also be used to hire agency temporary staff to support permanent staff assigned to this legislative effort.

Any change requires a process to ensure changes are correctly applied to the system. This involves Project Managers that manage the team that completes the update, business analyst that documents and reviews the system changes, architect services that analyzes how the update could have an effect on other systems or DOL processes, developers who create the change, and testers and quality assurance teams that ensure the update is working correctly.
