Part II: Narrative Explanation

II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact

Significant provisions of the bill and any related workload or policy assumptions that have revenue or expenditure impact on the responding agency by section number.

Background: In 2019, the legislature tasked the Walla Walla Management Partnership and the Department of Ecology to collaboratively develop a 30-year strategic plan for water management in the Walla Walla Basin. Together with the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation, the State of Oregon and stakeholders on both sides of the state border, the partners began this process, dubbed Walla Walla Water 2050, later that year. The final Walla River Basin over the next 30 years.

Under current law, the Department of Ecology implements water supply solutions through the Office of Columbia River under chapter 90.90 RCW as part of the Columbia Basin Water Supply Initiative.

This bill would codify existing practice and approach to implementing the Walla Walla 2050 Strategic Plan through the Department of Ecology's Office of Columbia River.

Section 1 of the bill would amend RCW 90.90.020 by clarifying that the one-third instream and two-thirds out-of-stream water supply allocation required under chapter 90.90 RCW for applications for water rights in the Walla Walla 2050 Plan adopted June 30, 2021, does not apply.

Section 2 of the bill would add a new section to chapter 90.90 RCW declaring that:

- (1) The Walla Walla Water 2050 Plan must be used as an integrated water resource strategy between Oregon, Washington and affected entities;
- (2) Ecology should seek to provide concurrent benefits to both instream and out-of-stream uses consistent with the 2050 Plan;
- (3) Any increase in water supply due to a project implement under Walla Walla Water 2050 would need to be considered water supply developed under this section;
- (4) Ecology will be advised by the Walla Walla Basin Advisory Committee and a broad range of interests;
- (5) Ecology will consult with federally recognized affected tribes and evaluate the development of a bi-state legal regulatory framework for new water resources;
- (6) Ecology shall submit a report to the legislature by June 30, 2025, with recommendations for the bi-state legal frameworl
- (7) Ecology is authorized to fund projects to implement the Walla Walla 2050 Plan that may be located outside the state;
- (8) New water supplies developed under this section must be allocated consistent with written agreements entered into with the State of Oregon and the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian reservation;
- (9) Ecology is authorized to designate water supplies developed under this section for instream flow purposes and placed into the trust water rights program;
- (10) Water supplies developed under this section need to be managed consistent with the intent of the specific project;
- (11) No more than 50% of the funding to implement projects from the Walla Walla 2050 Plan shall be from state funding sources and the remaining share shall be from local, federal or private funding sources, and;
- (12) Nothing in this section prevents Ecology from regulating water users consistent with existing adjudications to ensure there is no impairment of water rights in the basin.

There is no fiscal impact to Ecology from this bill. Section 1 would provide clarification in statute for existing practice. Under section 2, Ecology already produces legislative reports related to the Columbia Basin, including the Walla Walla Basin so there is no change in current workload for the report due in June 2025. Other elements included in section 2 is work already included in the workplan of the Office of Columbia River and do not have new fiscal impact.

Part IV: Analysis A. SUMMARY OF BILL

Description of the bill with an emphasis on how it impacts local government.

This bill will not impact local government revenues or expenditures.

Section 1 amends RCW 90.90.020 [Columbia River Basin Water Supply - Allocation and development of water supplies] to specify the "application for water rights in the Walla Walla river basin implementing the Walla Walla water 2050 plan adopted June 30, 2021" is not subject to the one-third/two-thirds allocation of water resources between instream and out-of-stream uses.

Section 2 adds a new section to chapter 90.90 RCW [Columbia River Basin Water Supply] to describe how the Walla Walla water 2050 plan will be implemented by the Dept. of Ecology. Section 2, subsection 4, describes "the Dept. will be advised by an advisory committee, including representatives from... local governments" among others.

B. SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURE IMPACTS

Expenditure impacts of the legislation on local governments with the expenditure provisions identified by section number and when appropriate, the detail of expenditures. Delineated between city, county and special district impacts.

This bill will require a local government representative to serve on an advisory committee. As of September 2022, there were four local government representatives on the Walla Walla Advisory Committee. Therefore, this requirement will not be a new cost and this bill will not impact local government expenditures.
