Section 1 amends RCW 90.66.065 to include the transfer of water rights for a family farm permit within a limited area of more intensive rural development or a master planned resort.

Section 2 amends RCW 36.70A.360 to provide that for counties planning under the Growth Management Act with master planned resorts to regulate all waters or the use of waters under the state statute amended in Section 1.

Part II: Narrative Explanation

II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact

Significant provisions of the bill and any related workload or policy assumptions that have revenue or expenditure impact on the responding agency by section number.

Under current law, chapter 90.66 RCW (the Family Farm Water Act) provides the conditions for the withdrawal of public waters for water rights designated as family farm permits. Changes or transfers to an existing water right are reviewed and issued by the Department of Ecology, and can involve changing the period of use, the place of use, the point of diversion or withdrawal, or the purpose or manner of use. Also under current law, chapter 36.70A RCW, Ecology works in partnership with the Department of Commerce, other state agencies, and local governments to implement the Growth Management Act (GMA).

This bill would amend RCW 90.66.065 and RCW 36.70A.360 to allow existing water rights designated as family farm permits to be changed to additional non-agricultural uses.

Section 1 would amend RCW 90.66.065(2)(c) to include limited areas of more intensive rural development and master planned resorts (as defined under chapter 36.70A RCW) in the list of uses authorized for the transfer of a family farm permit.

Section 2 would amend RCW 36.70A.360(2) to include chapter 90.66 RCW as an applicable statute for the regulation and control of water use under the GMA.

This bill has no fiscal impact to Ecology. The bill would enable existing family farm permits to be transferred to use for more intensive rural developments and master planned resorts, which is similar to the current allowance to transfer family farm permits for use within urban growth areas. Due to the limited and targeted nature of the language of this bill, Ecology does not anticipate increased workload from this change outside of the normal change application process.

Part IV: Analysis

A. SUMMARY OF BILL

Description of the bill with an emphasis on how it impacts local government.

This legislation would allow Family Farm permit transfers to counties for use in limited areas of more intensive rural development (LAMIRDs) and master planned resorts.

Sec. 1 would amend 90.66.065 RCW

Amends the transfer of a family farm permit for any purpose of use that is a beneficial use of water, if the water right is for the use of water at a location within the boundaries of a LAMIRD, or a master planned resort.

Sec. 2 would amend 36.70A.360 RCW

Amends master planned resort statute such that it is consistent with the amendment made in Sec. 1.

The bill takes effect 90 days after adjournment of the session in which the bill is passed.

B. SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURE IMPACTS

Expenditure impacts of the legislation on local governments with the expenditure provisions identified by section number and when appropriate, the detail of expenditures. Delineated between city, county and special district impacts.

This bill would have no fiscal impact.

The Washington State Association of Counties indicate that the bill would be a local option for counties who would choose to enter into an arrangement with a Family Farm permit holder to transfer water rights established under the Family Farm Water Act. As such, the bill does not have a county impact, but it gives counties another option to obtain water rights from Family Farm permit holders.
