- 3. No calculations will be performed in this sub-fund.
- 4. No new formulas will be added for this new sub-fund.
- 5. Minimal structural edits only for this new sub-fund.
- 6. Reports will be modified to reflect the new sub-fund.

OSPI assumes the implementation of this bill would cost \$39,000 in FY 24.
