Part IV: Analysis

A. SUMMARY OF BILL

Description of the bill with an emphasis on how it impacts local government.

Sec. 1 amends RCW 4.16.340 by eliminating he childhood sexual abuse statute of limitations.

Sec. 1 (1) clarifies that there is no time limit to commence an action based on intentional conduct brought by a person for recovery of damages for injury suffered as a result of childhood sexual abuse.

Sec. 2 adds a new section to declare that the elimination of the childhood sexual abuse statute of limitations applies to all claims, causes of actions, and proceedings, regardless of when the claim or cause of action arose.

B. SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURE IMPACTS

Local law enforcement, prosecutors, and public defenders could experience increased costs due to removing the statute of limitations for childhood sexual abuse. However it is unknown if this will change the number of childhood sexual abuse charges. Therefore, the local government cost impact is indeterminate.
