Sec. 1 amends RCW 19.27.042 to add (3): By July 1, 2026, the state building code council shall adopt standards for temporary emergency shelters and make them available for local adoption.

This legislation would provide jurisdictions with a local option to adopt temporary emergency shelter standards from the state building code council's standards that the state building code council must adopt by July 1, 2026.
