#### II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact

Significant provisions of the bill and any related workload or policy assumptions that have revenue or expenditure impact on the responding agency by section number.

This bill expands an existing property tax exemption for adult family homes that serve eligible people with developmental disabilities.

SECTION 1 amends RCW 84.36.042 to expand the property tax exemption for property used to house eligible people with development disabilities. The exemption is expanded to include both housing provided directly by the nonprofit organization, corporation, or association, or housing provided indirectly in cases where it is owned or leased by a nonprofit and then leased, sublet, or subject to a service agreement with a provider operating an adult family home under chapter 70.128 RCW that specifically provides services for persons with developmental disabilities. The indirect operator does not need to be a nonprofit.

SECTIONS 2 and 3 amend RCW 84.36.805 to exempt properties exempt under RCW 84.36.042 from qualifying conditions noted in RCW 84.36.805(2)(a).

SECTION 4 notes the act applies to taxes levied for collection beginning January 1, 2024.

SECTION 5 states RCWs 82.32.805 and 82.32.808.

## Part II: Narrative Explanation

#### II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact

Significant provisions of the bill and any related workload or policy assumptions that have revenue or expenditure impact on the responding agency by section number.

#### CURRENT LAW:

The law allows an exemption for real and personal property owned or leased by a nonprofit organization, corporation, or association to provide housing to persons with developmental disabilities.

#### To qualify:

- The organization, corporation, or association must be a nonprofit 501(c)(3); and
- The nonprofit organization, corporation, or association must be organized for charitable purposes to create and preserve long-term affordable housing for low-income with developmental disabilities.
- The housing must be occupied by eligible persons with low income.
- The property must be used exclusively for the purposes for which the exemption was granted, except for the annual 50 and 15-day exceptions for exempt nonprofit entities provided in current law.

#### PROPOSED LAW:

This bill expands the current nonprofit exemption for developmental disabilities housing to allow real and personal property owned or leased by a nonprofit organization, nonprofit corporation, or nonprofit association. This expansion allows the developmental disabilities housing to qualify for a property tax exemption, even if the property is leased, sublet, or subject to a service agreement with a provider operating an adult family home and without regard to the nonprofit status of the adult family home operator.

The new tax preference performance provisions do not apply to this proposal.

#### **EFFECTIVE DATE:**

This bill takes effect beginning with property taxes due for calendar year 2024.

Section 2 expires January 1, 2033.

Section 3 takes effect January 1, 2033, and does not expire.

#### ASSUMPTIONS:

- For an organization to qualify for this exemption the Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS) must approve the organizations registration.
- Only one known organization in King County qualifies for this exemption.
- Very few additional organizations/properties will qualify.

#### DATA SOURCES:

- County assessor, property roll data
- Department of Revenue, State Property Tax Model
- Economic and Revenue Forecast Council, November 2022 forecast of income growth

#### **REVENUE ESTIMATES:**

This legislation results in no revenue impact to the state property tax levy. This exemption results in a minimal shift of taxes to non-exempt taxpayers as few properties will qualify for this exemption.

This exemption causes a shift of local property taxes by increasing local levy rates. Local districts at or near the statutory maximum rate may experience an indeterminate loss of revenue.

#### **ASSUMPTIONS:**

This estimate affects nonprofit entities that own real and personal property used to provide housing and services to persons with developmental disabilities.
