#### II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact

This bill creates temporary exemptions from certificate of need requirements for kidney disease centers.

Section 1: Adds a new section to 70.38 RCW (Health Planning and Development) allowing a kidney disease center to request an exemption from the Department of Health (department) to exceed its authorized number of dialysis stations during a temporary emergency or surge situation. This bill requires the department to respond to temporary exemption requests within 24 hours. It defines temporary emergency and surge situation, outlines the information that would need to be submitted to the department, and directs the department to adopt rules to implement this section.

Section 1: The department will develop and adopt rules to create a temporary exemption process from certificate of need requirements for kidney disease center. The department anticipates utilizing a team of subject matter experts to implement this bill. This team will consist of the program manager and a community engagement specialist to identify underreached communities and engage them in the rulemaking process. This process will include two meetings with interested parties as well as one formal rules hearing, all held virtually, and will take approximately 12 months to complete. The department anticipates providing the rules hearing announcement and materials in both English and Spanish and providing ASL and Spanish interpretation services at the rules hearing.

Costs include staff, associated expenses (including goods and services, travel, intra-agency, and indirect charges), and Office of Attorney General support in the amount of \$4,000.

FY 2024 one-time costs will be 0.2 FTE and \$32,000.
