II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact

Significant provisions of the bill and any related workload or policy assumptions that have revenue or expenditure impact on the responding agency by section number.

The bill is in regards to proceedings to preclude establishment of parentage when a parent alleges that a person committed a sexual assault that resulted in the parent becoming pregnant and subsequently giving birth to a child.

Section 1(4) changes the ability for a parent to seek preclusion of parentage in sexual assault case from four years to ten years after the birth of the child.

Section 1(5) requires a fact-finding hearing within 75 days unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Section 1(12) requires the court to appoint an attorney for the petitioner or respondent if they are indigent and meeting outlined circumstances.

Section 2 is a new section which requires OCLA to enter into contracts to provide legal services in preclusion proceedings, and must remain within appropriated amounts.

Section 3(19)(b) modifies the definition of a "parent" to exclude a person against whom a court has entered a final order removing the person from establishing or maintaining parentage of a child.

Section 4(9)(f) modifies visitation of the perpetrating parent and the child to not be allowed prior to fact finding or dismissal of the petition unless both the parent and child are shown to have a bonded relationship and the court finds it in the best interest of the child.

Section 6(4) adds concurrent legal jurisdiction is allowed under this bill with dependency court.

Section 7 is a new section that requires the perpetrating parent to attend proceedings remotely until fact finding.
