HB 2001 adds a section to chapter 28B.10 RCW to read as follows:

(1) Beginning in the 2024-25 academic year, institutions of higher education that offer an early course registration period for any segment of the student population must have a process in place to offer students who are eligible veterans, national guard members, active duty military members, and their spouses, domestic partners, and dependents early course registration.

Although there is no fiscal impact, the addition of "spouses, domestic partners, and dependents early course registration" is new as previously it was only spouses or domestic partners – adding dependents to priority registration will add about 250 +/- students to early registration.

Section 1: New section is added to chapter 28B.10 6RCW to read as follows: (1) Would require institutions of higher education that offer an early course registration period for any segment of the student population to have a process in place to offer eligible: veterans, national guard members, active duty military members and their spouses/domestic partners, and dependents early course registration beginning in the 2024-25 academic year. The requirement for an early course registration process is as follows:

(a) New students eligible under this subsection with a completed admission process must be offered an early course registration period; and (b) Continuing/returning former students eligible under this subsection who have met current enrollment requirements must be offered early course registration among continuing students with the same level of class standing or credits determined by the institution's policies (2) For purposes of this section, "eligible veterans or national guard members" has the same meaning as in RCW 28B.15.621.

CWU does not estimate any fiscal impact based on the language of this bill.

HB 2004 relates to early registration at institutions of higher education for eligible military students.

Section 1.1 states that any institutions that offers an early registration period for any segment of the student population must have a process in place to offer early registration to veterans, national guard members, active duty military and their spouses, domestic partners, and dependents, as follows:

Section 1.1 (a) states that new military students who are eligible and have completed all of their admissions processes must be offered an early registration period.

Section 1.1(b) states that continuing military students who are eligible must be offered early registration among continuing students of the same class standing or credit as determined by the institution.

The requirements of this bill are already met by the early registration processes in place at The Evergreen State College, and the college plans to continue these practices whether the bill becomes law or not.

There is no fiscal impact to The Evergreen State College from this bill.

#### Overview:

New Section 1: Beginning in AY 2024-25, institutions of higher education that offer early course registration for any segment of the student population must have a process in place to offer students who are eligible veterans, national guard members, active duty military members, and their spouses, domestic partners, and dependents early course registration if they meet the criteria under subsection (a) and (b) of this section.

## Anticipated Fiscal Impact:

The Veteran Service Office (VSO) serves 450-550 students per quarter, all of whom are eligible for early/priority registration AFTER their first quarter at Western. We do not believe that new students would need to be included (for early registration), but there would be impacts to other areas (Admissions Office and also the office of New Student Services/Family Outreach (NSSFO)) if early registration must be created for new students. So, unless this bill applies to NEW students, there would not be a fiscal impact for the VSO as they already have a process in place and facilitate early registration for their population of continuing students.

If the bill applies to new students, the additional costs would be for Admissions (revisions to systems and to the application, to collect different and additional information) and to NSSFO (to build new communications and reconfigure the existing programming that opens up reservations for new students).

Cost to admissions would be about \$1,000 (one–time expense). Cost to NSSFO would be ongoing (estimate \$1,000 to \$3,000 annually).

This bill would provide early registration opportunities at Institutions of Higher Education for eligible veterans, national guard members, active duty military members, and their spouses, domestic partners, and dependents.

#### **SECTION 1**

Beginning in the 2024-25 academic year, institutions who offer an early course registration period for any segment of the student population must have a process in place to offer early course registration to eligible students identified in the bill. Eligible students include eligible veterans, national guard members, active-duty members, spouses, domestic partners, and dependents. This applies to new, continuing and returning students and is applicable to granting priority within credit or class level as other students.
