Section 2 of this bill amends RCW 10.97.050 to authorize data dissemination as detailed in Section 1.

The proposed legislation has no fiscal impact to the Washington State Patrol (WSP).

Section 1 adds the authorization for bailiffs of the supreme court to conduct threat assessments on behalf of supreme court justices, which includes the ability to receive criminal history records that includes nonconviction data.

Subsection 2(8) allows for the dissemination of said data and prohibits the dissemination or use of the data for purposes other than authorized in this subsection.
