- (b) "Human safety operator" means a person who controls the entire dynamic driving task for an autonomous vehicle.

Section 2. Amends RCW 46.92.010 to allow autonomous vehicles to be operated on a public roadway unless they meet the requirements in Section 1.

Effective date: 90 days after the adjournment of session.

This bill allows qualified autonomous vehicles; levels 4 and 5, to be deployed on public roadways with a human operator present at all times.

2.A – Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact

Section 1. Creates a new section in Chapter 46.92 RCW to allow autonomous vehicles on public roadways if they meet the below requirements:

- (1) Must meet federal standards and regulations for a motor vehicle.

This bill allows a new type of autonomous vehicle on the roadways and DOL expects an indeterminate increase in revenue based on the unknown number of level 4 and level 5 autonomous vehicles that would register.
