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Part IV: Analysis

A. SUMMARY OF BILL

Description of the bill with an emphasis on how it impacts local government.

This bill would allow reimbursement contracts for water-sewer extension, water and sewer facilities, and street projects to last up to 20 years.

Sections 1, 2, and 3 would amend RCW 57.22.020, RCW 35.91.020, and RCW 35.72.020, respectively, to extend the period of time property owners may pay connection charges if they did not contribute a portion of the public facility construction costs. This period is extended from 15 to 20 years. This section is also amended to allow extensions for contracts executed prior to February 29, 2020 due to a national economic recession or the COVID-19 pandemic. Requests for COVID-19 state of emergency extensions must submitted prior to March 31, 2025. Local governments are not required to notify property owners.

This legislation would take effect 90 days after adjournment of the session in which the bill is passed.

B. SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURE IMPACTS

This bill would not impact local government expenditures.

The requirement to notify property owners subject to reimbursement obligations has been removed in this bill. This results in a de minimus reduction of work for local governments.
