Part IV: Analysis A. SUMMARY OF BILL

Description of the bill with an emphasis on how it impacts local government.

Section 1 of the proposed legislation would amend RCW 71.24.580, removing the time limitation that funds from the criminal justice treatment account may be used for the provision of substance use disorder treatment services and treatment support services for nonviolent offenders for 180 days after having graduated from a drug court program during the 2021-2023 and 2023-2025 fiscal biennia. Accordingly, funds from the criminal justice treatment account would be able to be used for this purpose beyond the 2023-2025 biennium.

The amendments in this section would also remove language related to approved criminal justice treatment account fund uses during the 2019-2021 and 2021-2023 fiscal biennia, and legislative transfer authority during the 2019-2021 fiscal biennium.

B. SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURE IMPACTS

The proposed legislation would have no impact on local government expenditures.

The proposed legislation would have no impact on local government revenues.

Both cities and counties administer drug courts and currently draw funds from the criminal justice treatment account for the provision of substance use disorder treatment services and treatment support services for nonviolent offenders for 180 days after having graduated from a drug court program, and the use of these funds would remain unchanged as a result of the provisions of the proposed legislation. In the absence of the proposed legislation, cities and counties would not be able to use funds from the criminal justice treatment account for these purposes beyond fiscal biennium 2023-2025.
