II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact

This bill relates to expanding economic assistance for individuals who are eligible for the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program.

Section 1(4) amends the maximum payment amount of diversion assistance, which provides brief emergency assistance once in a given 12-month period to qualified adult applicants, in order to help some families avoid needing to rely on the payment as an alternative to TANF. The payment amount is increased from \$1,500 to \$2,000 effective January 1, 2025.

The Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS) Economic Services Administration (ESA) Diversion Cash Assistance (DCA) program currently has sufficient funding to support this increase to the DCA payment amount. ESA anticipates associated impacts to caseload, workload, and information technology (IT) to be minor, and able to be absorbed within existing resources. Therefore, ESA estimates no fiscal impact.
