This bill is one of The Department of Natural Resources (DNR)'s agency request legislation and authorizes the Commissioner of Public Lands to enter into interlocal agreements with federally recognized Indian Tribes. This allows Tribal police officers to enforce natural resource infractions on DNR-managed land. This bill does not seek reciprocal authority to carry out law enforcement on Tribal lands. The bill amends RCW 7.84.10 (Natural resource infractions) and RCW 43.12.065 (Rules pertaining to public use of state lands).

As this bill provides authorization only, there is no direct fiscal impact.

The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) assumes that there is some staff time required to initiate and support any future interlocal agreements, and that there is existing staff capacity to implement the bill.

DNR assumes that the authority is for the Commissioner of Public Lands and does not impact other state agencies' responsibilities or law enforcement operations.
