Sec. 1 defines biogenic carbon dioxide. The UTC assumes no fiscal impact.

The UTC does not have authority over public utility districts producing or distributing biogenic CO2 and existing statute already authorizes public utility districts to sell fuels to transportation end-use customers via transportation tariffs approved by the commission. In evaluating the fiscal impact of the bill, given that the underlying process already exists and there would be no filing increase because of the legislation, there may be indirect effects of adding biogenic CO2 to the list of alternative fuels that public utility districts may sell wholesale to investor-owned utilities, but such indirect effects would not materially impact the workload or filings before the commission. The UTC assumes no fiscal impact.

# Part IV: Analysis

### A. SUMMARY OF BILL

Description of the bill with an emphasis on how it impacts local government.

This note is on 2069 S HB and compares it to 2069 HB.

#### CHANGES BETWEEN THIS VERSION AND THE PREVIOUS VERSION:

This substitute version of the bill allows public utility districts to sell biogenic carbon dioxide and other biogas products to either an end-user or at wholesale. The definition of "biogenic carbon dioxide" is also amended to provide clarification that biogenic carbon dioxide includes carbon dioxide produced as a byproduct from biological processes in an industrial or manufacturing facility rather than as a byproduct from industrial or manufacturing processes.

These changes do not affect the fiscal impacts discussed below.

#### SUMMARY OF CURRENT BILL VERSION:

This legislation would allow public utility districts to sell biogenic carbon dioxide to an end-user or at wholesale.

This legislation would take effect 90 days after adjournment of the session in which the bill is passed.

#### B. SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURE IMPACTS

This bill would not impact local government expenditures due to the local option.
