II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact

Significant provisions of the bill and any related workload or policy assumptions that have revenue or expenditure impact on the responding agency by section number.

Section 1 New

This section directs the Secretary of Health to issue a statewide standing order prescribing the use of epinephrine in school districts. The epinephrine may be administered by a school nurse, or other designated trained personnel for any student or individual experiencing anaphylaxis on school property, bus, field trip, or school activity.

Section 2 Amends RCW 28A.210.383 and 2014 c 34 s 1

- (2)(a) Clarifying language is added that the Secretary of Health, or their designee, are now classified as a licensed health professional that has the authority to prescribe epinephrine in accordance with section 1. Clarifying language is also added that epinephrine prescriptions must be accompanied by a standing order in accordance with this section or section 1 for epinephrine to be administered.
- (3)(a) This section now allows schools to utilize the school supply of epinephrine on a student that has an epinephrine prescription on file.
- (3)(b) This section changes the reference from RCW 28A.210.300 to 28A.210.380.
- (4)(b) This section allows the standing order directive in section 1 to be an allowable authority in the event epinephrine needs to be administered.
- (5) This subsection is removed which required OSPI to review the anaphylaxis policy and make recommendations to the education committees by December 1, 2013.
