II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact

The difference between HB 1924 and SHB 1924 is as follows:

In sub-sub-section 3(4)(vii), definition of project of statewide significance, the wording "a fusion energy facility" is struck in the substitute.

This change does not result in a change in Ecology's fiscal impact for this bill.

Under current law, chapter 43.394 RCW, Ecology is responsible for co-chairing a clean energy siting coordinating council with the Department of Commerce. The council is required to provide an annual report beginning October 1, 2024. This bill would add a recommendation to the council's annual legislative report and amend the definition of projects of statewide significance.

Section 2 (2) would amend RCW 43.394.020 to add a recommendation of whether and when fusion energy could be expected to be an appropriate category on which to carry out a non-project environmental impact statement to the list of required recommendations that the coordinating council would be required to include in the annual report.

Section 3 would amend RCW 43.157.010 to add "facility manufacturing or assembling component parts for fusion energy facilities" to the definition of "project of statewide significance."

Under section 2, Ecology assumes that the new item for the council to consider would be part of existing work to develop the legislative report. Under section 3, the addition of these facilities to the definition would not change existing regulatory permit requirements under the Shoreline Management Act. Therefore, Ecology estimates no additional fiscal impact as a result of this bill.
