The fiscal note has changed since the previous fiscal note for senate bill 5920. Substitute senate bill 5920 removes the repeal for psychiatric hospitals to obtain a certificate of need and amends RCW 70.38.111 (Certificates of need—Exemptions) and RCW 70.38.260 (Certain hospitals not subject to certificate of need requirements for the addition of the number of new psychiatric beds) extending their end dates to June 30, 2028. Additionally, this substitute amends RCW 70.38.270 (Psychiatric beds added under RCW 70.38.260) to include an expiration date of June 30, 2029. The date changes throughout this bill create an extension of an already existing body of work therefore no fiscal impact.
