Theater Operators: Educate them about the new legal requirements and best practices for implementing open captioning. General Public: Raise awareness among the deaf and hard of hearing community about their rights under the new law. Collaborative Efforts: Partnering with advocacy groups and industry associations to facilitate smooth implementation and address any challenges that arise.

Conclusion:

The primary impact of Substitute SB 5486 on WSHRC involves education, eventually some type of enforcement, such as monitoring, investigating of complaints. WSHRC would need resources to engage in education and outreach efforts to inform theater operators and the public about the new provisions, ensuring effective implementation and awareness of the enhanced accessibility measures.

This act takes effect January 1, 2026.
